She has led Psycho-Social well-being awareness sessions in more than 200 schools in partnership with Save the Children and developed a research-based module creation for about 20,000 children, to effectively address their emotional concerns post Covid-19.

Ms. Mahima Arora is an Associate Psychologist and a counseling Psychologist. At Atma Prakash, she is currently managing in-house and partnered projects with initiatives like 'Teach for India' and 'Save the Children' where she takes counseling sessions, coordinating and conducting training sessions with teachers and students.

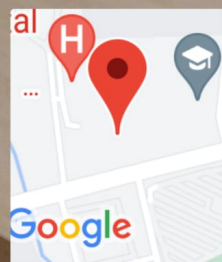

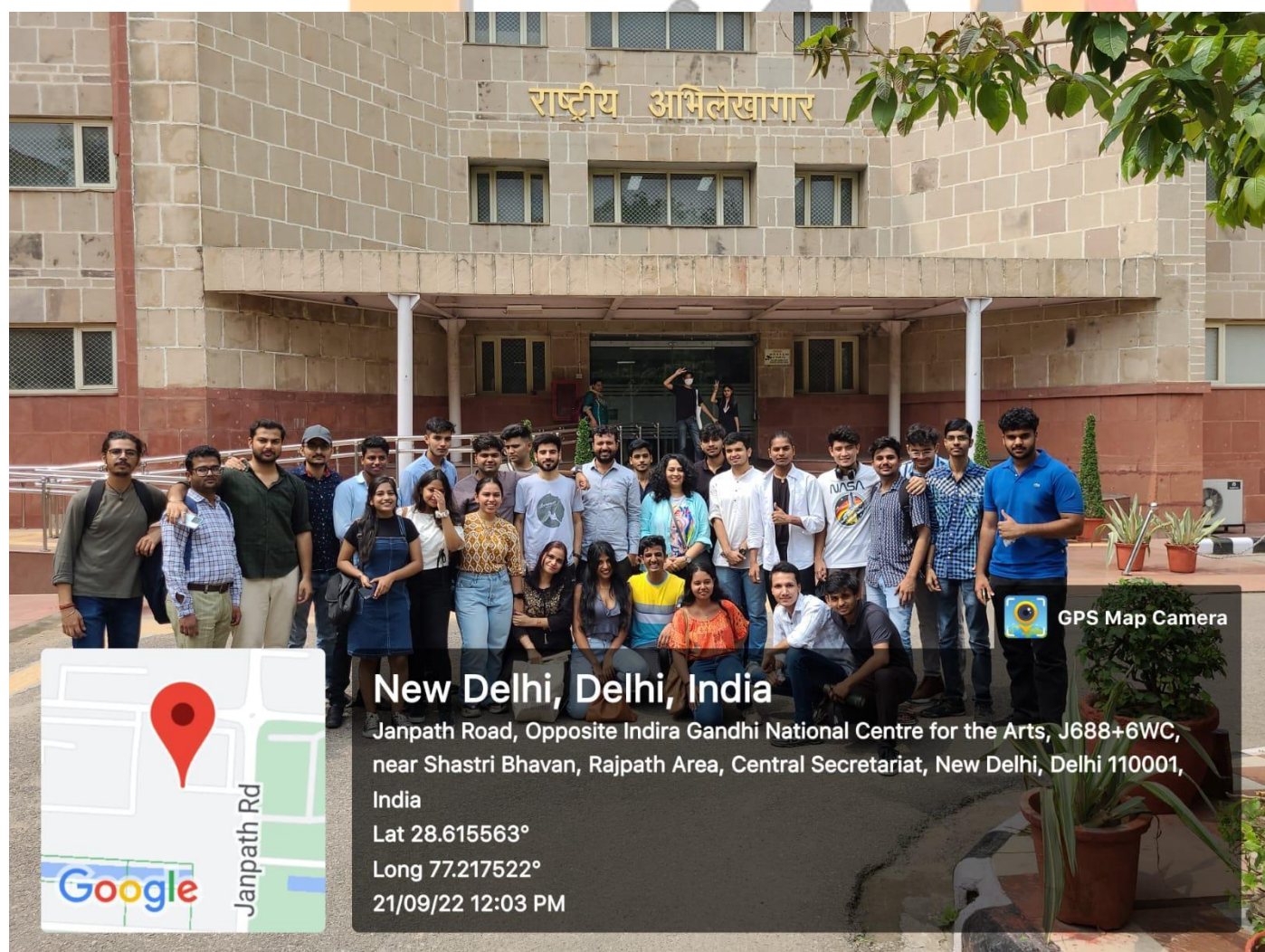

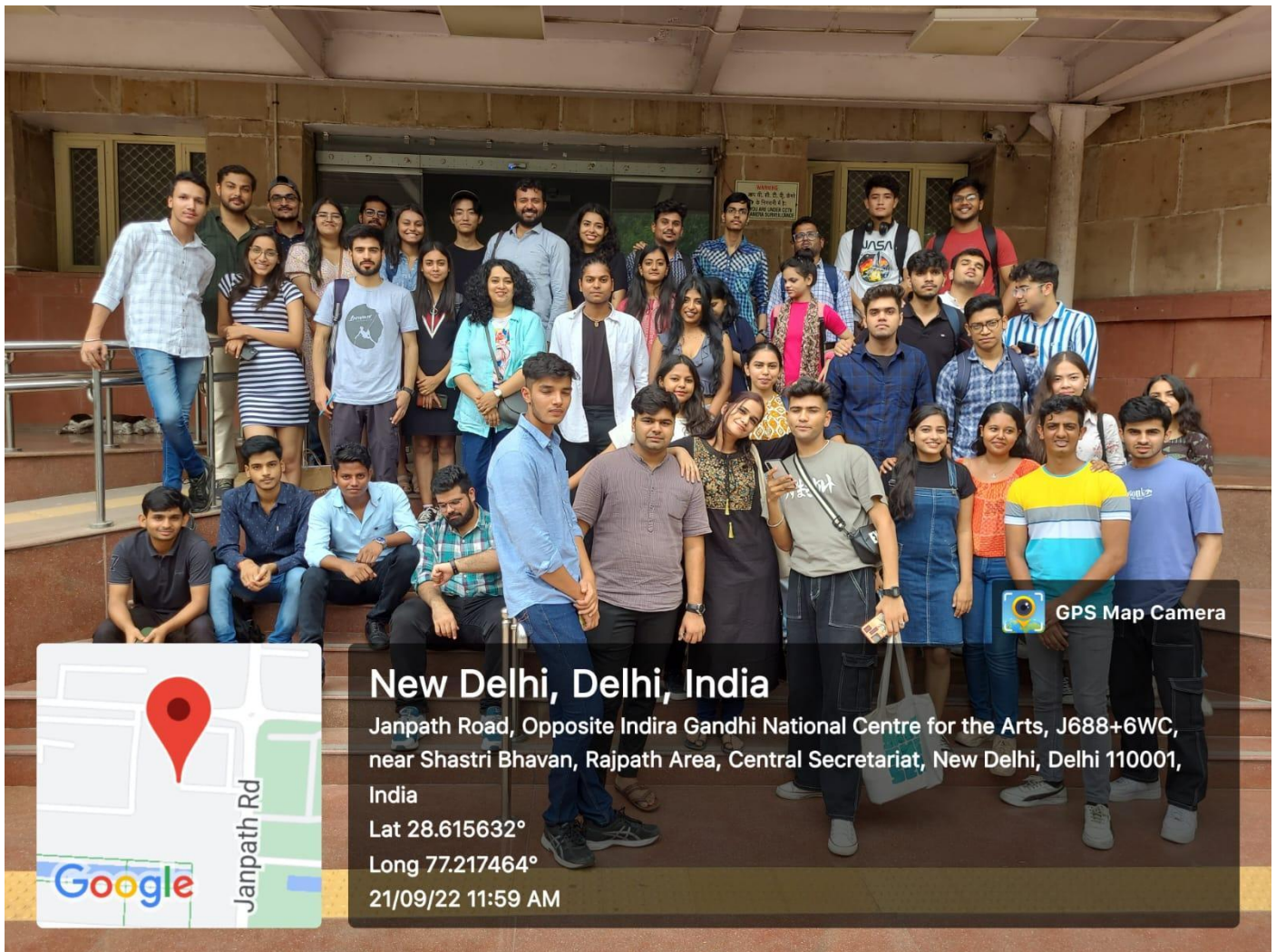


It was a much required visit for the History Hons students as the students got to know much about the struggle and fight against the Britishers by common people for the independence of India. As the exhibition was focused on Saga of Freedom, Known and lesser known struggles and the students know already a lot on the known and prominent struggles such as 1857 revolt, Champaran Satyagrah 1917, Non Cooperation Movement 1920, Chauri Chaura 1922, Dandi March 1931. This visit to National Archives of India opened the eyes of students to the lesser known fights and struggles by Indians against British as well such as 'Chuar Uprising in West Bengal 1771-1809, Kumar Namdhari Movement in Punjab 1871, Chapekar Brothers 1897, Munda Revolt in Ranchi 1894, Allport Bomb case Muzaffarpur 1908, Haruka Movement Manipur 1930, Kirti Kisan Movement 1927 and many more such revolts and fights that student got acquainted with.

Students got to know that how most of the freedom fighters were well qualified, some were barristers, poets, writers, businessmen coming from poor as well as elite backgrounds this makes us realise that how big their sacrifices were for the freedom of India, they left everything behind for the one cause. Students saw the handwritten imprisonment judgments, death sentences passed against freedom fighters by British judges and magistrates like one against Chapekar brothers. Letters of Gandhiji, diary of Bhagat Singh and many such precious records were shown to students

At the end of the museum walk students sat in a conference hall with the professor of Archives provided by college as guide to discuss about what they felt and how they perceived the valuable archives of India. It was a well interactive and educational session allowing the attendees to speak up their thoughts on freedom struggle.

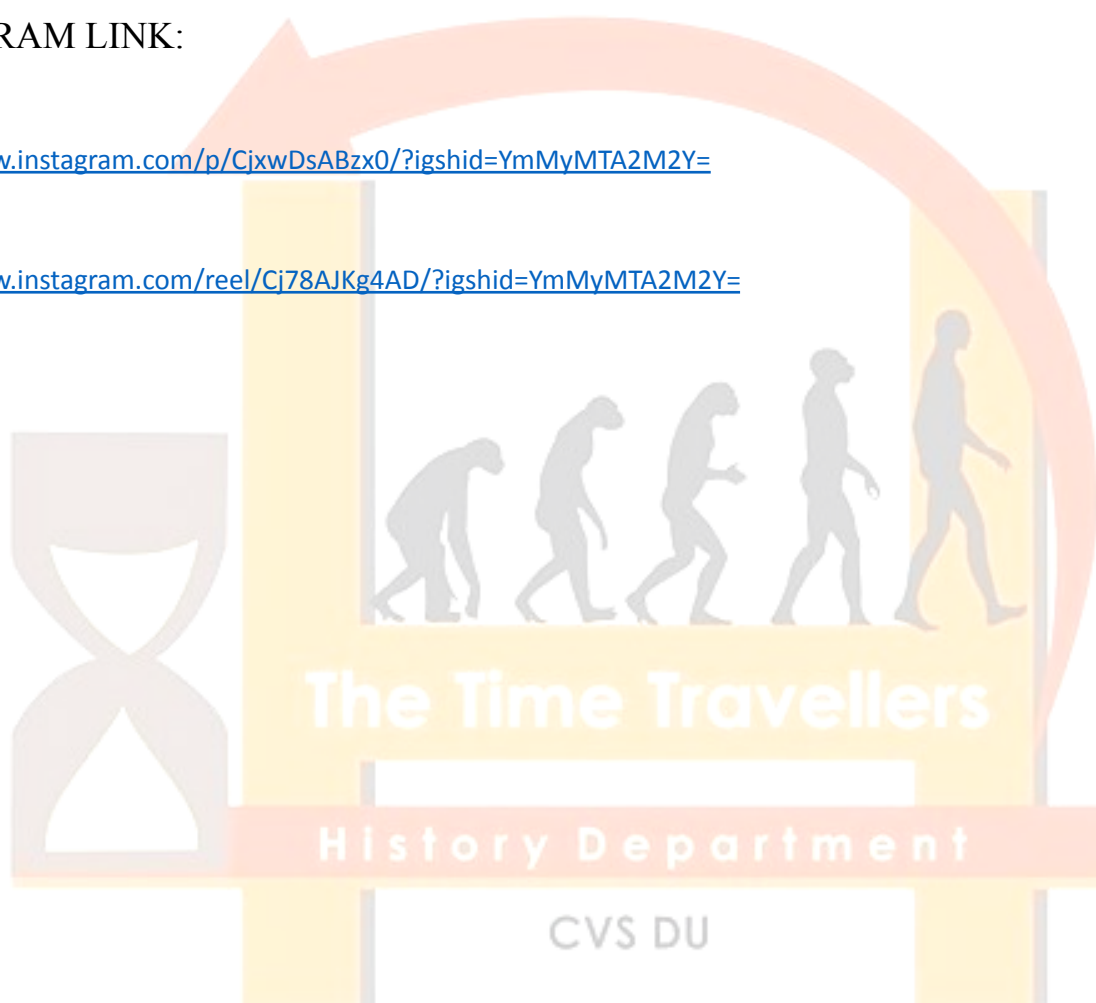

- Mr. Sanjib Kumar Singh, an archaeologist and museologist, in national museum, ministry of culture, govt of India.

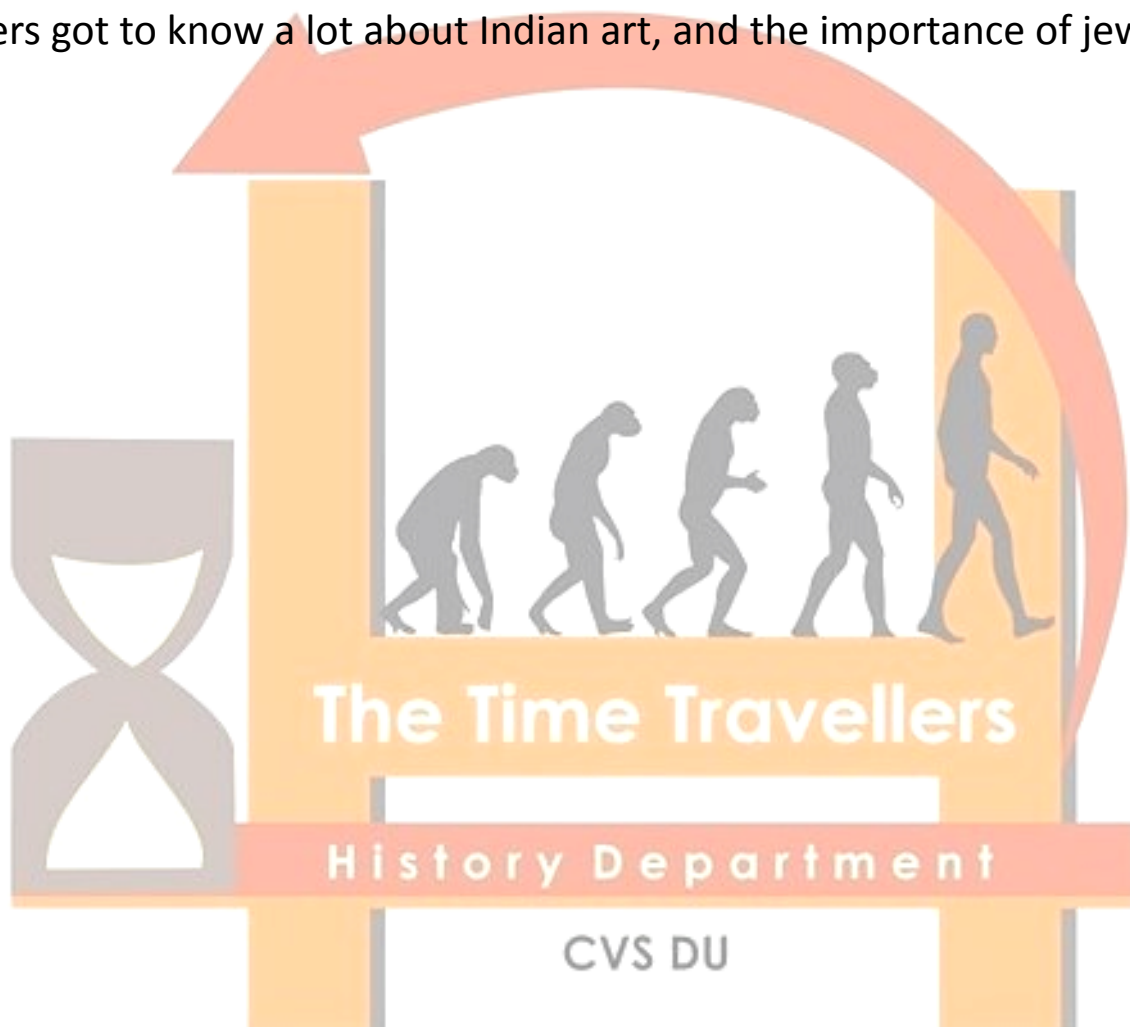
LECTURE TOPICS:

DHARAMSHALA TRIP REPORT

On **March 2nd, 2023**, **22 students** along with two teachers of the History department of College of Vocational Studies visited Dharamshala in Himachal Pradesh, intending to explore one of the best hill stations in India. The trip was organized for three days starting from the **2nd of March till the 6th**.

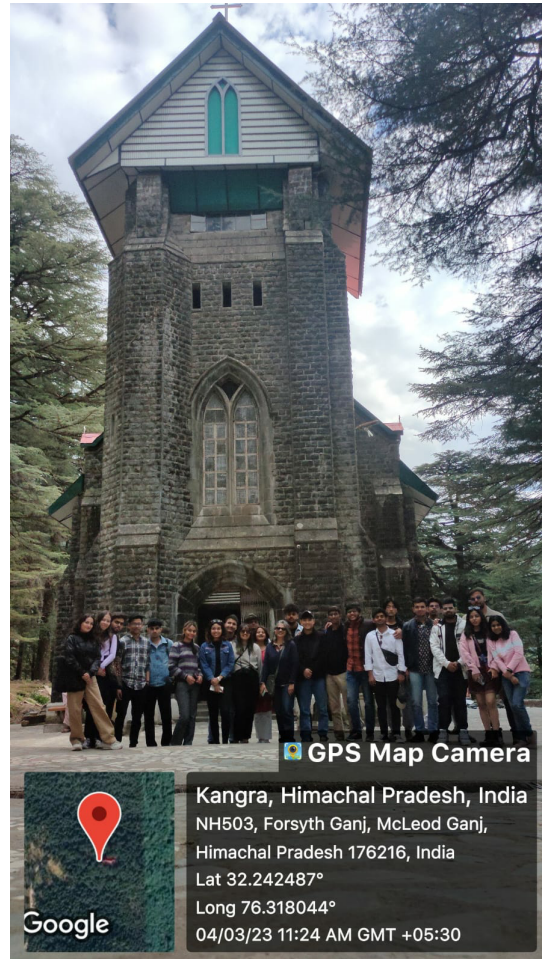
After reaching the city in the early morning of 3rd March, we decided to visit our first place of visit, the Norbulingka institute, which preserves Tibetan art through self-sustaining means. Norbulingka's art studios including Tibetan statue-making and thangka paintings were exceptional in that they intrigued us to know more about their techniques. Set amidst the Norbulingka gardens was the Tsuglagkhang complex, containing murals of Buddha, and drawings of chronicles of the Dalai Lama. The Losel Doll Museum also fascinated us with its displays of miniature Tibetan dolls in traditional costumes. Popularly known as the 'little Tibet in India', the city makes us familiar with Tibetan culture and tradition. After having a splendid lunch then, we drove towards our second destination in Khanyara valley. Crossing several streams, coniferous forests, and steep rocky places, we mounted towards the snow point, and the trekking experience we had there was incredibly memorable.



Our second day was filled with a lot more fun to explore in McLeodganj. Firstly, we visited St. John in the Wilderness Church in McLeodganj, built in neo-Gothic architecture and surrounded by a deodar forest. This classic monument, dedicated to Lord Elgin, one of the viceroys of India, attracts us with its amazing architectural design and lovely glass windows. Then we moved on to our next place of visit, the Namgyal Monastery, which holds the title of the largest Tibetan temple outside Tibet, where the Dalai Lama is believed to have his abode. The large prayer hall with Buddhist hymns created a uniquely peaceful environment all along. The overlooking

Himalayas made the monastery even more atmospheric. It filled us with an ecstatic spiritual experience.

Being one of the famous tourist shopping centers in Himachal, McLeodganj markets are flooded with trendy styles of clothes, Tibetan handicrafts, thangkas, Tibetan carpets, prayer flags, Tibetan artifacts, and small prayer wheels. We had a great time bargaining, purchasing, and

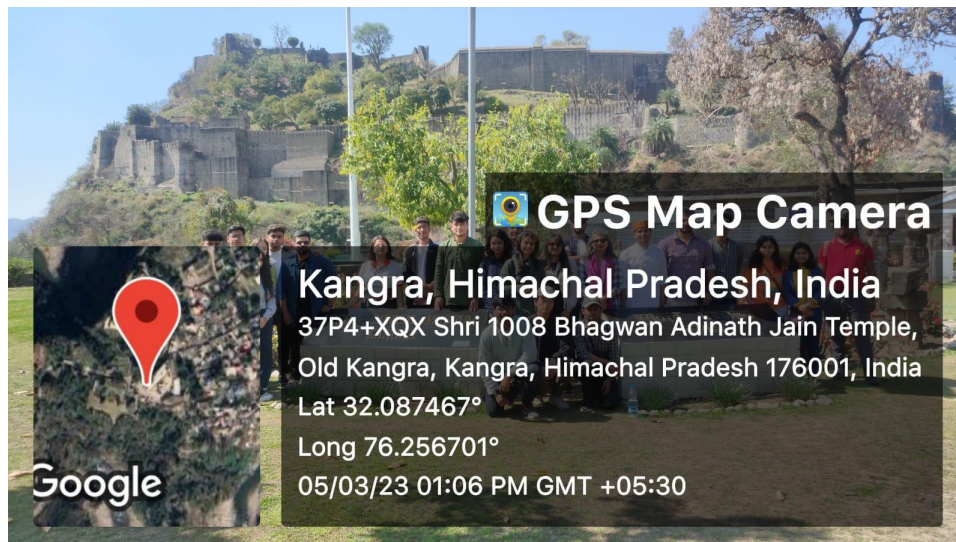


exploring the local markets.



Located about a few km away from the Bhagsunath temple were the Bhagsunath waterfalls, at the base of the Dhauladhar valley which is also considered to be a religious spot. The serenity and ambiance of this place made us feel fresh besides the spectacular beauty of the falls. The cafes and coffee houses nearby served light refreshments, and we enjoyed snacking while viewing the gorgeous Bhagsunag Waterfall.

Our final day had two destinations, the Kangra Fort and Masroor rock-cut temple. Kangra fort, located about 20 km from the town of Dharamsala on the outskirts of the town of Kangra, is claimed to be the oldest fort in Himachal Pradesh. Being students of history we were excited and curious to know more about the fort with such tricky entrances designed with stone carvings, majestic rampant parts, huge walls made of black stone, stone shrines of Lakshmi-Narayana and Ambika Devi, and a history of several invasion attempts.



Dubbed the Himalayan Pyramid, Masroor Rock Cut Temple, our final destination, was a popular archaeological site built between the 8th-9th century AD. A group of 15 monolithic rock-cut temples designed in Indo-Aryan style and the main shrines containing the stone idols of Rama-Laxman and Sita were the major attractions of the place. This magnificent temple can also be viewed from the top with a pleasant scenic beauty around it.



Overall the trip was an incredible experience where we spent three days exploring different cultures, cuisines, traditions, and ways of living. We returned to our homes with a bunch of wholehearted memories that will be cherished forever.

Everyone who came to the event, was given a free brownie in exchange for their precious thoughts.



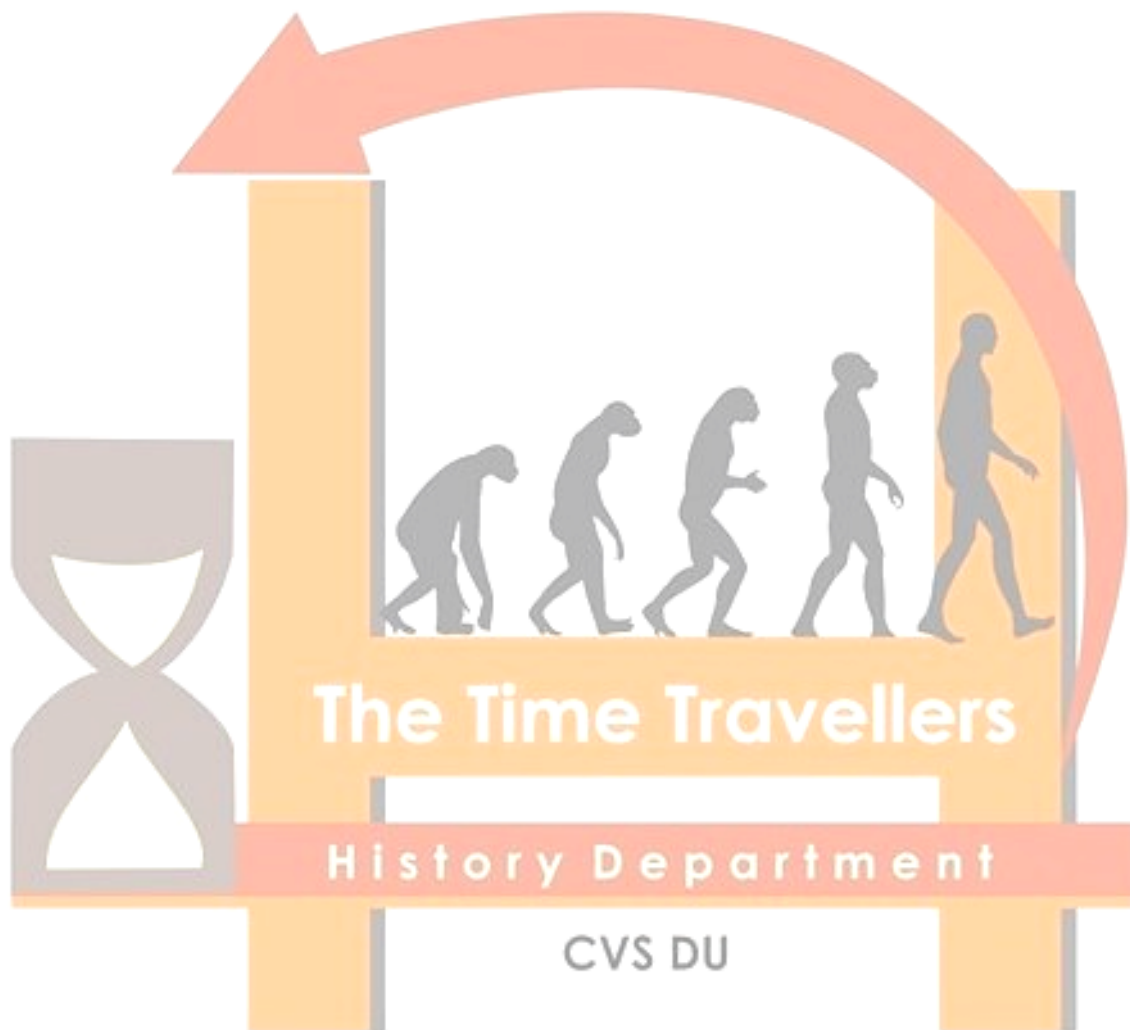
